The Club uses a computer programme called DutyMan to manage club duties. It is a condition of membership that members attend for their allocated duties so data is stored on DutyMan as a condition of membership. Only telephone numbers and an email link are shared, this is only to members, and you can opt out of having that data shared with other members.

Things you need to know and do. (Please retain)

Welcome to Sully Sailing Club ('the Club') where we hope you will have a safe and enjoyable time.

Being a Club member or visitor of course comes with terms and conditions. By signing up for the Club's activities, you are undertaking to abide by the Club's Rules and the provisions of its' Constitution.

You must take time to fully read the Rules, which are kept at the information desk in the Clubhouse, and on the Club website at <http://www.sully-sailing.org.uk/> Copies of the Constitution are similarly available.

When you put to sea from the Club in your boat, kayak, or windsurfer, you are venturing onto an inlet of the Atlantic Ocean known for having some of the highest tides and strongest currents in the World.

In that context the Club's Rules and Constitution **include** various requirements such as the **examples** below:-

You accept and acknowledge that:-

- a) Sailing is by its nature an unpredictable sport and therefore inherently involves an element of risk and Members, guests and visitors accept responsibility for exposing themselves to such inherent risks
- b) You will comply at all times with the Club Constitution, Rules, policies procedures and instructions, and decisions made in respect of those provisions by Club Officers
- c) You accept responsibility for any injury, damage or loss to the extent caused by your negligence
- d) You will not participate in Club activities whilst your abilities are impaired by alcohol or drugs or whilst otherwise unfit to participate
- e) A Patrol Boat crew will be assigned for dinghy racing on Sundays at a time determined by the Club Committee and listed in the sailing programme. Outside these times sailing may take place, but at the persons own risk since a Patrol Boat will not normally be available. The provision of Patrol Boat cover is limited to such assistance as can be practically provided in the circumstances.
- f) Effective personal buoyancy must be worn by occupants of all craft. Wet suits and dry suits in themselves are not adequate buoyancy.
- g) Wet suits, dry suits or effective thermal protection shall be worn when afloat during the months of December to March (inclusive) and are strongly recommended at all times and especially during the months of April and November. For children under the age of 18 years this shall be mandatory between November and April (inclusive) and strongly recommended at other times.
- h) You are required to keep your craft in a seaworthy condition. All craft shall be of a type suited to sea conditions and shall have adequate buoyancy to support the craft and its normal crew in the event of capsize or swamping for an extended period. Inflatable side buoyancy bags shall, where fitted, be adequately secured by straps of at least 25mm wide. It shall be the sole responsibility of each owner or helm to ensure that the buoyancy of his/her craft is adequate and remains so whilst sailing.
- i) All members' boats – including canoes & wind surfers - shall have adequate third party insurance cover (minimum £3M, recommended £5M) for the duration of the season. Temporary members' boats must also have the same level of cover whilst at the Club.
- j) The Officer of the Day (OOD) shall have sole discretion as to whether any scheduled racing shall take place and shall have given due regard to the existing weather conditions and sea state, and to whether the Patrol Boat can be launched and recovered without damage. The OOD's decision is final and shall not be challenged by any other member.
- k) Members are required to assist in the running operation of the Club, including Duties, Work-Parties, and Committees. Members will be scheduled to be on Race Duty on Sundays, 3-4 times per year, and are expected to be available for the duty on the day scheduled or to swap the duty using the DutyMan system.
